# Report of the Editor of *The Journal of Finance* for the Year 2003

This is my first report, having begun as editor on June 1, and it is my pleasure to report that *The Journal of Finance* continues to thrive. Submissions set new records again last year, and the *Journal's* impact and visibility remain very high. The previous editor, Rick Green, clearly turned the reins over to me with the *Journal* in great shape, and I will do my best to maintain the *Journal's* superb quality and reputation. I am also very grateful for all of the help Rick has given me during the transition.

During 2003, The Journal of Finance published 93 articles, selected from a large number of submitted manuscripts. The Journal continues to attract submissions at an increasing rate. Table I details the number of submissions during the year. Both total and new submissions received during 2003 exceeded the previous year's record levels by about 12%. The number of total submissions for the first time averaged more than 100 per month, and in July the number of new submissions hit 100 for the first time. There were 970 new submissions received during the whole year. Thus, given the number of submissions relative to the number of papers published, the Journal is likely to remain highly selective, publishing less than one of every ten new submissions received. Table II details the editorial decisions made, by round, in 2003. At the same time, the Journal's published articles continue to represent a large and diverse base of expertise across our profession, with 102 institutions listed among authors' primary affiliations (up from 94 last year). Table III lists the affiliations of authors publishing in The Journal of Finance during 2003 as well as the number of authors per institution (where an article with *n* authors is counted as 1/n articles for each author's institution). The leading institutions this year were New York University (5-7/12) and the University of Texas at Austin (3-5/12).

The *Journal's* ability to select from many high-quality submissions no doubt accounts for much of the visibility and impact of its published articles. According to the most recent figures compiled by the ISI Web of Knowledge, the articles published in the *Journal* during the previous two years were cited an average of 3.5 times per article during 2002. This "impact factor," up nearly 18% from the previous year, continues to rank the *Journal* first among business and finance journals and behind only the *Journal of Economic Literature* and the *Quarterly Journal of Economics* among all economics journals.

This was a year of transition for the Journal in a number of respects. The start of my term on June 1 coincided with the Journal's move to an electronic system

for submitting manuscripts and managing the review and editorial process. Authors now submit manuscripts electronically, paying the submission fee by credit card or by using a balance having been created previously by submitting timely referee reports. Referees receive requests to review by email and then access manuscripts and submit anonymous reports using the web site. By yearend, over 400 referee reports had been submitted in this fashion. I believe the electronic system has worked rather well even during this initial period, and the feedback we have received from both authors and reviewers has certainly been more positive than negative. The system was developed for us by BEPress, and they continue to operate it and provide technical support. A number of tweaks and improvements have been made to the system, and I anticipate that more will be forthcoming as we gain experience. Special thanks goes to David Pyle, who was instrumental in negotiating an agreement with BEPress and in helping me deal with them during the various design and set-up phases that began in mid 2002 and continued through May of this year. I should also

add that David has been a great help in general both to me and my editorial assistant, Wendy Washburn.

The transition to the current board of associate editors also coincided with a change in their role in the editorial process. Rather than have an associate editor's primary responsibility be to provide referee reports, I decided I needed help of a different sort, made a bit more feasible with the electronic system. In most cases, I ask one of the associate editors to take a look at a newly submitted manuscript, to give me a brief preliminary assessment of its potential suitability for the *Journal*, and to suggest a referee. Experience thus far convinces me that this procedure generally yields far better referee selections than I could manage on my own, and the additional feedback is often valuable in the editorial process. The associate editors are doing a wonderful job in this role, and I am grateful for their hard work and dedication.

It cannot be said too often that the success of the *Journal* rests largely on the efforts of our colleagues, not just as authors, but also as referees. Once again this year, the *Journal* called upon over 700 of our colleagues who, with few exceptions, gave generously of their time and effort to produce timely and insightful reports. In general, turnaround times remain quite good, with about 73% of decisions rendered less than 60 days from submission and only about 10% taking 100 or more days. Table IV provides details on turnaround for editorial decisions made by Rick and me during 2003, and Appendix A lists the individuals who refereed for *The Journal of Finance* during the year.

Rick has been generously handling resubmissions of all manuscripts that were originally submitted to him, except that recently we agreed I would take over on any files with a lapse of more than a year since the most recent correspondence. There is a good supply of articles for upcoming issues. I am just now beginning to accept articles, which I expect will appear in either the February or April issues of 2005. At its recent annual meeting, the AFA Board of Directors approved an expansion of the page budget of the August issue to 504 pages, the same as that of the other five issues. Prior to this change, the page budget of the August issue had been only 384 pages, owing to its former status

as the Proceedings issue. The additional 120 pages should allow the *Journal* to publish an additional three to four articles per year.

The *Journal* awards a number of prizes for articles that it publishes. The Brattle prizes recognize a first-prize paper and one distinguished paper in the area of corporate finance. The Smith Breeden prizes recognize a first-prize paper and two distinguished papers in all other areas. The eligible papers for the 2003 prizes were all those published in the six issues of the *Journal* from December 2002 through October 2003. The associate editors nominated the papers and then voted for the prize winners, and my editorial assistant handled the balloting. In this transition year, I asked all associate editors who had served during the year with either Rick or me to participate in the process. This year there were 15 nominations for the Smith Breeden prize and 11 nominations for the Brattle prizes. Appendices B and C list the winning papers as well as those that were nominated. I have congratulated the authors of the nominated papers, and the winning papers were announced at the Business Meeting of the AFA in San Diego.
